#### EASTER MUSIC



Saturday April 11th at 8.15 pm St. Francis Xavier Cathedral Wakefield St., adj Victoria Sq.

<u>Deutsche Johannes Passion – Christoph Demantius (1567–1643).</u> This work relates the events of Holy Week in a delicate but dramatic style, ideally suited to the atmosphere and acoustic of the Cathedral. It is in six parts and makes much use of character portrayal.

<u>Tenebrae Responsories</u> – <u>Thomas Luis de Victoria (1548–1611)</u>. Victoria studied in Rome in the Palestrina school but retains a more extrovert, arresting style which reflects his Spanish origins. The text contemplates the betrayal and death of Christ.

#### ROMANTIC MUSIC

This concert features 19th and 20th century Romantic works – including motets by Bruckner (<u>Locus Iste</u>, <u>Ave Maria etc.</u>), part–songs by Elgar (<u>The Shower</u>, <u>My love Dwells in a Northern Land</u>), and some of the delightful harmony pieces of Brahms, Schubert, and Hugo Wolf. On this occasion, we are proud to be associated with the <u>TREVELYAN DUO</u> – Merryn Brose and William Hennessy (of the Australian String Quartet) – who will perform the Elgar <u>Violin Sonata</u>.

## CHRISTMAS MUSIC



Saturday December 5th at 8.15pm St. Francis Xavier Cathedral

<u>The Christmas Story</u> - <u>Heinrich Schutz</u>. Schutz was a major precursor to Bach, and his setting of the Nativity is part of the great German tradition of church music. On the same theme, but in a different style is:

<u>Lauda per la Nativita del Signore</u> by <u>Ottorino Resphigi</u>. This modern Italian composer, famous for his suite of <u>Ancient Airs and Dances</u>, has created a charming Christmas narrative, with contralto (Mary), soprano (Angel) and tenor (Shepherd) soloists, and a small wind ensemble. There are many musical references to older styles.
